residing at SHIVANSH, BLOCK NO. 5/B, NATARAJ NAGAR, NATARAJ NAGAR MAIN ROAD, UNIVERSITY ROAD, RAJKOT-360005 (GUJARAT), are writing this joint letter to bring to your attention a matter of grave concern regarding the mental and emotional well-being of our minor child/grandchild, Master SHIVANSH RAJIV VORA, aged 8 YEARS, who is currently in the custody of his mother, Mrs. DARSHANA RAJIV VORA ALIAS DARSHANA YOGESHKUMAR BHATT, and her paternal family at SHIVAM, E-97, RAVI RATNA PARK, STREET NO. 4, UNIVERSITY ROAD, RAJKOT-360005 (GUJARAT).

Despite being the biological father and paternal grandparents, we have been repeatedly denied the opportunity to meet or speak with the child. This obstruction has been carried out deliberately by the child's mother and her family members, even though there are no legal orders restricting us from access or visitation.

This ongoing denial of contact amounts to parental alienation and is deeply harmful to the emotional and psychological development of the child. The child is being deprived of love, affection, and emotional bonding with his father and paternal grandparents — relationships which are vital to a child's healthy upbringing.

As per Article 9 of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC), which India has ratified, a child has the right to maintain direct contact with both parents and extended family, unless it is deemed contrary to the child's best interests. Furthermore, the National Policy for Children, 2013, recognizes the importance of family and emotional support in the life of every child.

We therefore humbly request the Commission to:

- Take cognizance of our complaint and treat it as a matter involving the rights and emotional well-being of a minor child.
- Direct the concerned district child protection authorities or legal support services to intervene and facilitate access and visitation.
- Ensure that the child is not subjected to further mental stress or manipulated to sever ties with his paternal family.

We respectfully request your urgent intervention in safeguarding the child's right to maintain a meaningful relationship with his father and grandparents.
